- Fall 2012 Present: Teaching first-year Chinese (EALC 10111, 11111 and 10112, 11112).
 - This is a five-credit beginner course, introducing and providing the basic training of elementary Mandarin pronunciation, grammar, reading and orthography. I was responsible for preparing classes, weekly schedules, quizzes, tests, students tutoring and assignment grading.

 - This course is aimed to enhance students' Chinese skills in business context by integrating the study of Chinese language with introduction to Chinese business environments and culture.

 - This course is designed for students who have completed two years of college-level modern Chine

 - This course adopts an innovative format that combines traditional classroom instruction and online self-learning. Students learn grammar through online tutorials and quizzes. Class time is optimized for enhancing student proficiency through intense drill work and authentic communicative tasks. I was responsible for preparing drill work and student tutoring.
- Fall 2014: Taught one session of first-year class (Heritage Track).
 - This course is designed to improve reading and writing abilities for Chinese heritage students who can conduct basic conversation at home.
- Fall 2013 Spring 2014: Taught fourth-year Chinese (EALC 40411 and 40412).

- This course is designed for students who have successfully completed three years of Chinese language or equivalent courses.
- Fall 2012 Fall 2013: Taught second-year Chinese (EALC 20211, 21211, 20212 and 21212).
 - This course is designed for students who have successfully completed one-year Mandarin Chinese language courses at the college level.
